RECORD FIRST THREE MONTHS FOR TORINO AIRPORT NEVER BEFORE SO MANY PASSENGERS IN THE JANUARY-MARCH PERIOD

After breaking the traffic record in 2023 with more than 4.5 million passengers the first three months of 2024 closed with 1.1 million passengers and a 7.6% increase in international passengers.

Record driven by snow traffic and Easter holiday boom

Caselle Torinese, 5 April 2024 – A record first three months for Torino Airport, which recorded its best first quarter ever with more than 1.11 million passengers handled from January to March 2024.

In the first three months of the year, 1,114,448 passengers used the airport, 3.7% more than in the same period last year (1,074,195 passengers). All three months - January, February and March - beat their respective monthly records of the previous year: January 2024, with more than 363,000 passengers, is 0.5% above the previous record of January 2023 (more than 361,000 passengers); February 2024, with more than 351,000 passengers, reports an increase of 4.5% over the same month in 2023 (more than 336,000 passengers); March 2024, with almost 400,000 passengers, reports an increase of 6.2% over the same month in 2023 (more than 376,000 passengers).

In the first quarter of 2024, international traffic was the driver of growth, recording a 7.6% increase in volume to account for 60% of total traffic: passengers on international flights increased from 620,000 in 2023 to over 667,000 in 2024.

This result was also achieved thanks to the excellent performance of snow flights in the 2023/2024 winter season. The number of skiers transported increased by 9% compared to the 2022/2023 season.

Flights for skiers from Northern Europe saw some new routes such as Belfast, in Northern Ireland (connected by Ryanair) and London Heathrow, in Great Britain (connected by British Airways), to which must be added the charter flight from East Midlands, also in Great Britain; furthermore, Air Baltic was added to Vilnius, in Lithuania (already served by Ryanair).

Tourist flows related to the Easter holidays also contributed significantly to the record for the quarter: flows during Easter week, from Maundy Thursday to Tuesday, in 2024 amounted to more than 85,000 passengers between arrivals and departures, up 7.9% on the figures recorded for the same days at Easter 2023 (around 80,000).
